

White Solmon Weekend

July 19th, 2014

The White Salmon trip is this coming weekend. Join us on this annual WRRR sponsored trip on a class 3+(V) run with one optional portage around Husum Falls. Some folks choose to run the eight to ten foot drop -- some don't even flip!

After dropping your boats at BZ corners (PUT IN), we meet at the Northwestern Lake (TAKEOUT) high noon – I2pm Saturday for the shuttle. The dam has been removed and a few things have changed in the last couple years, please be aware.

Camping is free for WRRR members at Hollenbeck campground Friday and Saturday nights. Non-WRRR members will be charged \$10 for camping in the WRRR site. Hollenbeck Park is in a beautiful setting right at the base of Mt Adams. There is a large grass field set amongst trees and a creek. It's a great area for throwbag practice, Frisbee Gold, or ???

There are many ways to get to the river. Below is one of the easier ones. As the date draws closer, you can find more routes on the WRRR.org forums, yahoo group or WRRR's Facebook page. Discussing routes to the white salmon can get as interesting as draining coolers, and even oar rights vs open vs pins/clips.

Driving Directions from WA HWY 14 to Hollenbeck Park:

- Turn north onto WA HWY 141-A for about 2.1 miles.
- Turn left onto WA HWY 141 for approximately 23 miles, keeping right at the Y (Gas Station).
- Turn left on a gravel driveway just past the creek approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ mile North of the Gas station. Keep your eyes peeled for the WRRR signs.
- After the turn on the gravel take your next right and you will soon see the WRRR camp.

- Hollenbeck Park - 33 Mt Adams Road - Trout Lake, WA

You will need to make your own arrangements for food, drink and camping/cooking gear. There are no planned events, but if you start one, we will follow.

Runs will be happening all day Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Alternate runs are nearby ranging from class 2+ all the way to class V!



Boat with your overnight gear, not seeing your car til a day later!

Join us for an overnight camping trip on the Beautiful Sauk River. This is a great trip for people getting into over-nighting and whitewater, or just looking for a quick local weekend retreat. The Sauk river is my favorite back yard run, and I would be more than happy to help describe the rapids and help you access your skills. The Highway 530 bypass is open and we are encouraged to use it to help promote local business between Arlington and Darrington.

Campsite #13 has been reserved at Bedal campground Thursday and Friday nights. There is limited room and parking at the campsite, however there is more parking across the street. We will keep the campsite and boat launch clear for staging and dropping gear.

We are planning to launch on the Upper Sauk (Class 2-3) Saturday morning and camp on one of the sandy beaches Saturday night. Sunday AM, we will finish the upper Sauk and continue onto the Middle Sauk (Class 3-3+). IF water levels are low, the trip will move downstream. A few of us will be doing a scout run on Friday to check things out and hopefully work on our sunburns. For more info Contact pinkyfilippini@ya-

Depending on who RSVP's we can do group or individual meals and gear hauling. If you're an IK and think you need help hauling gear, we should be able to accommodate you.

Once we have an approx. number of people, we will determine groovers, cooking gear, safety gear and other group gear that may be needed or helpfu. Trip leaders will be there early to assist people rigging their overnight gear, answering questions and helping split up group gear. The first day is a shorter float and there are only a couple of class 2+ rapids. This will give you a chance to rearrange your gear or ask for help that night. If there are a lot of boats we will launch in smaller float pods (6-7 boats) and meet in pre-designated large eddy areas for safety check, camp, lunch and to regroup.

Final launch times and float plans will be complete JUNE 8th

Here are the stats for 2014 29th GRCU:

New record boater turnout: 224 registered volunteers for a total of 608 volunteer hours.


New record for least amount of garbage removed: Less than I cu.Yd. 900 to 1000 lbs. (This is a good thing)

New record rain fall for GRCU:

New record or near new record for GRCU flows: 2150 cfs; great level, only 2nd time in GRCU history at flows over 2000 cfs. No reports of incidents, which is common at these flows.

A cleaner Green River, more awareness, lots of personal first descents as well as long time GRCU veterans again made this the biggest best clean-up in the PNW. 


